Fei Qi is a distinguished professor at Shanghai Jiao Tong University. He received his Ph.D. from University of Science and Technology of China in 1997, and conducted his postdoctoral work at Lawrence Berkeley National Laboratory and Sandia National Laboratories from 1998 to 2003. He was a professor at National Synchrotron Radiation Laboratory, University of Science and Technology of China during 2003-2014. In early 2015, he moved to Shanghai Jiao Tong University. His research interests include the development of mass spectrometry, laser spectroscopy and their applications in combustion and energy research.

Prof. Qi has co-authored more than 230 peer-reviewed journal papers. He was elected as a fellow of American Physical Society in 2012, a fellow of the Combustion Institute in 2018. He gave a plenary lecture on the 34th International Symposium on Combustion. He serves as a member of the Board of Directors of the Combustion Institute since 2012, and Secretary for Section Affairs of the Combustion Institute since 2016. Currently he is the Chair of China Section of the Combustion Institute. He served or currently serves as a member of the Editorial Board of several journals including *Progress in Energy and Combustion Science*, *Combustion and Flame*, *Proceedings of the Combustion Institute* and *Review of Scientific Instruments* etc. He is Program Co-Chair of the 38th International Symposium on Combustion in 2020.
